Debden Summer Watering



Effective May 1, 2016

You may water at the following times: Between 6:00 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. THERE IS NO WATERING FROM 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

AND NO WATERING AFTER 9:00 P.M.

<u>East of Main Street-</u>Monday, Wednesday and Friday <u>West of Main Street-</u>Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday

ABSOLUTLEY NO WATERING ON SUNDAYS !!

By Order of the Council for the Village of Debden, the following fines are in effect:

1st Offense- Warning

2nd Offense- \$50.00

3rd and Subsequent Offenses - \$100.00

If you see anyone abusing this schedule, it is your duty to report them to the Village Office. If there is no answer, leave a message. Although you are allowed to water on the above days and times, you should not be watering 6 hours per day.

<u>Spring Clean Up</u>

Now that the snow is gone, please take a minute to pick up all garbage around your property, business and the street in your area. Keep Debden Clean.

Water Information Quick Facts

(courtesy of Sask H20– Government of Saskatchewan)

- * A single lawn sprinkler may use 50% more water in just one hour than a combination of ten toilet flushes, two 5-minute showers, two dishwasher loads and a full load of clothes.
- Water consumption usually drops 18-25% after a water meter is installed.
- A 5-minute shower with a standard shower head uses 100 litres of water whereas a 5-minute shower with a low-flow shower head only uses 35 litres.
- * During the summer, about half of all treated water is sprayed onto lawns and gardens.
- Residential Water Use in Canada <u>Toilet</u> 30%, <u>Bathing and Showering</u> – 35%, <u>Laundry</u> – 20%, <u>Kitchen/Drinking</u> – 10%, <u>Cleaning</u> – 5%.
- * The average residence uses over 100,000 gallons of treated water per year (inside and outide)
- Health Canada suggests checking for leaky faucets and pipes – Even the smallest drip can waste as much as <u>35 litres a day!!</u>

Business Licenses

All Contractors doing work in the Village of Debden are required to have a business license. This includes all electricians, plumbers, builders, contractors, roofers, window installers, carpet cleaners, furnace cleaners, etc. All transit traders (Door to Door Salesman) must have a Business License from the Village of Debden. Ask anyone who comes to your door to see their license. It would be a great help if you reported these people to the Village Office.

Who Can Run?

Persons eligible for nomination must:

- \Rightarrow be at least 18 years old on Election Day
- \Rightarrow be a Canadian Citizen
- ⇒ have resided in the Village of Debden for at least 3 consecutive months immediately preceding the date the nomination paper is submitted; and have resided in Saskatchewan for at least 6 consecutive months immediately preceding the date nomination paper is submitted.
