By Order of the Council for the Village of Debden, the following fines are in effect:

**1st Offense**- Warning

**2nd Offense**- \$50.00

**3rd and Subsequent Offenses**- \$100.00

## Water Information Quick Facts

(courtesy of Sask H2O- Government of Saskatchewan)

- \* A single lawn sprinkler may use 50% more water in just one hour than a combination of ten toilet flushes, two 5-minute showers, two dishwasher loads and a full load of clothes. About half of all treated water is sprayed on lawns and gardens during summer.
- \* A 5-minute shower with a standard shower head uses 100 litres of water whereas a 5-minute shower with a low-flow shower head only uses 35 litres.
- \* The average residence uses over 100,000 gallons of treated water per year (inside and out)
- \* Health Canada suggests checking for leaky

## Notice to Utility Consumers

The Village of Debden has been reviewing their utility rates. It is the position of Saskatchewan Municipal Board that all water and sewer utilities in Saskatchewan be self-sustaining and that any surplus be set up for Capital. As we have not been meeting this expectation, the Village has passed Bylaw 6/2017 to increase our utility rates. These will take effect when we receive approval from Sask. Municipal Board; possibly as early as July 2017

## Grass Clippings

**A reminder that all grass clippings and leaves must be in a clear bag with no other garbage.**

## **Building/Demolition Permits**

*A Permit must be completed if you are doing or having any work done on your home, garage or sheds. This includes all renovations, new construction- decks/fences, moving in sheds, or the demolition or removing of any building. Some construction*

## **Business Licenses**

*All Contractors doing work in the Village of Debden are required to have a business license. This includes all electricians, plumbers, builders, contractors, roofers, window installers, carpet cleaners, furnace cleaners, etc. All transit traders (Door to Door ) must have a Business License from the Village of Debden. Ask anyone who comes to your door to see their license. It would be a great help if you reported these people to the Village*

## Clean Water and Wastewater Fund

In January 2017, the Government of Canada and the Government of Saskatchewan announced new funding available for key infrastructure priorities. As part of this bilateral agreement, the Village of Debden was fortunate to have been approved for partial funding for a new Lift Lagoon and Lift Station. Construction will be starting in Spring of 2017 and should be done by September 15, 2017. We ask that you respect the construction process and do your part in a safe construction site by avoiding the area .



### **What kind of emergencies trigger alerts?**

Alerts are issued for emergencies that could harm people or damage property. For example, alerts may be issued for:

- tornadoes, plow winds
- blizzards, wildfires
- hazardous material spills,
- drinking water advisories,
- evacuations, or local emergency declarations

### **How do I get the alerts?**

Download the SaskAlert app on your iPhone or android smartphone to receive emergency alerts in real time. You can also access [SaskAlert.ca](http://SaskAlert.ca) for information on alerts. Emergency alerts are broadcast on TV and radio networks as well

### **Does my municipality have my contact information?**
